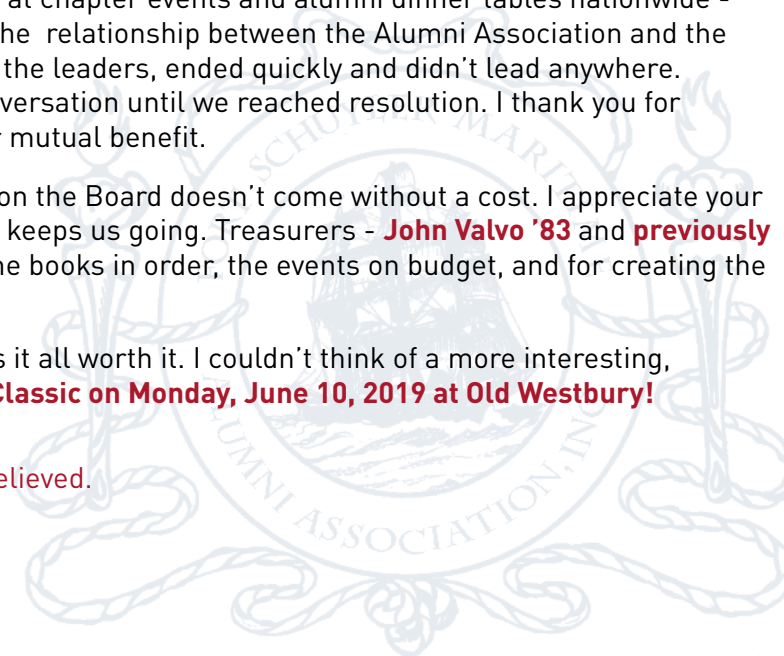

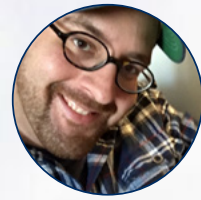

TREASURER'S ANNUAL REPORT

December 31, 2018

Greetings, Fellow Alumni!

We are pleased to issue our first dedicated Annual Report to you, the membership. In the past, we have distributed the financial status of the Fort Schuyler Maritime Alumni Association (FSMAA) through the Fort Schuyler MARINER magazine. With the renewed relationship solidified between the Alumni Association and SUNY Maritime College allowing the issuance of a joint alumni magazine – FORT SCHUYLER – we felt it best to issue the financial status in the manner of a formal Annual Report.

The Fort Schuyler Maritime Alumni Association, Inc. remains the underlying legal corporate entity of our Association. However, we have received authorization from New York State to conduct business under the name Maritime College Alumni Association (MCAA). For legal filings, the FSMAA name is required; as such, you may see the two names interchanged on occasion.

This Treasurer's Report summarizing the MCAA's financial situation comes with good results in fiscal year 2018.



Highlights of this year's financial results are as follows:

- Our total support to the College for fiscal year 2018 was \$249,142.
- The organization earned an unaudited net income of \$16,005.
- Net income was almost 9% higher than budget and nearly 50% greater than that of 2017.
- Revenue from events were slightly under budget.
- Yearly expenses came in under budget by about 8%.



At the Admiral's Dinner on May 1, 2018, the Treasurer enjoyed a lighter moment when presenting the \$250,000 of SST Scholarships from the Alumni Association to the College's Representative Ashley Scotti, Director of Annual Giving.

Note regarding 2017 Audited results:

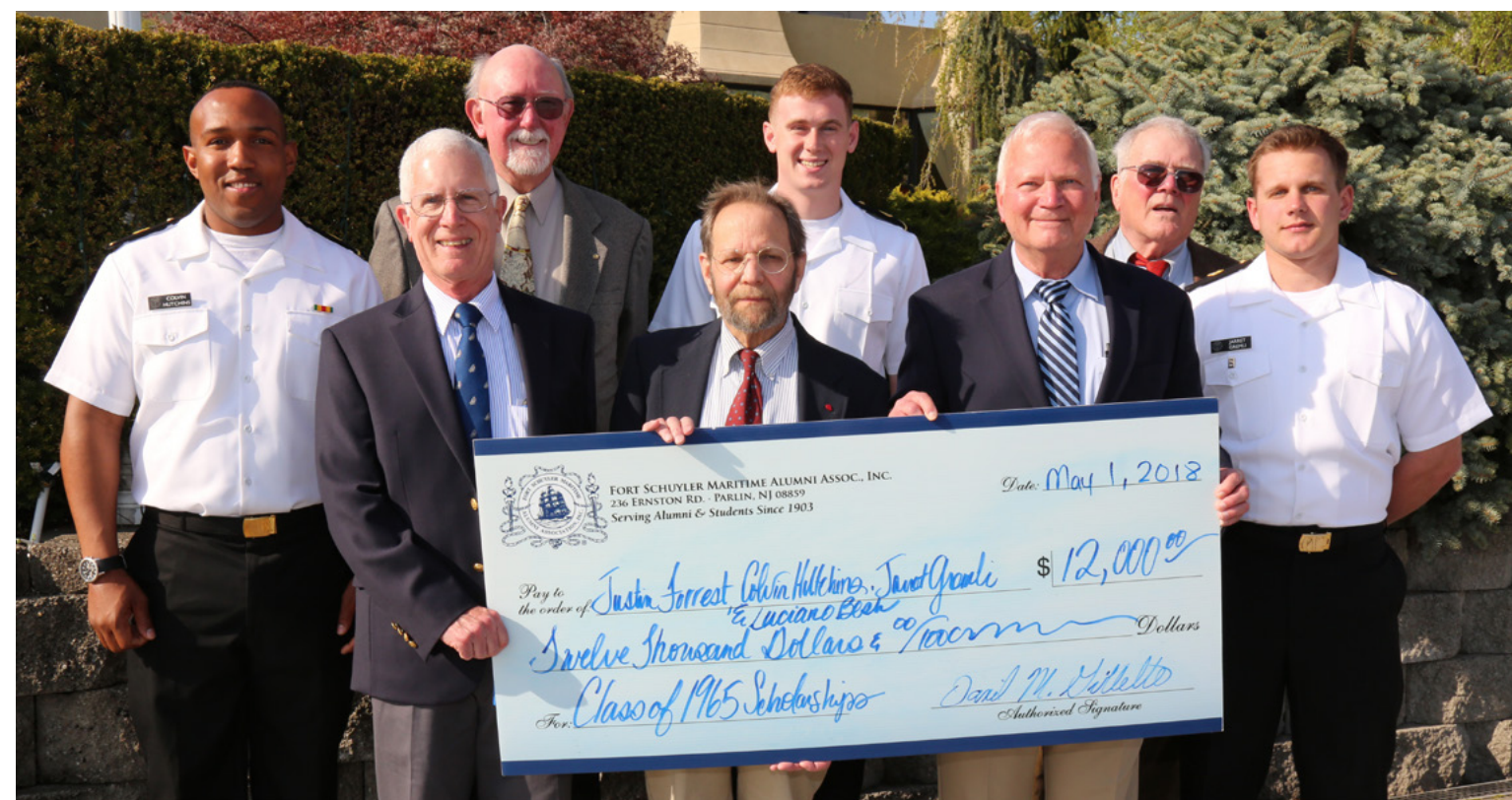
The independent auditor Condon O'Meara McGinty and Donnelly LLP audited our financial statements from 2017 and expressed that our books are in good order. The auditor considered our internal controls to the extent they believe necessary to determine and conduct the audit to render an opinion. They found no significant deficiencies or material weaknesses during their audit, and there were no adjustments made, a trend we are committed to continuing. Our internal controls ensure transactions are authorized, executed and recorded properly.



Bookkeeping duties are performed by Verma Associates. Kamal Verma puts in an enormous amount of time and effort into this audit as well as monthly monitoring of Income and Expenses. Kamal has been with the FSMAA since April 2010, and is very dedicated to the organization.

Below are the highlights of our financial standing for the year ended December 31, 2018:

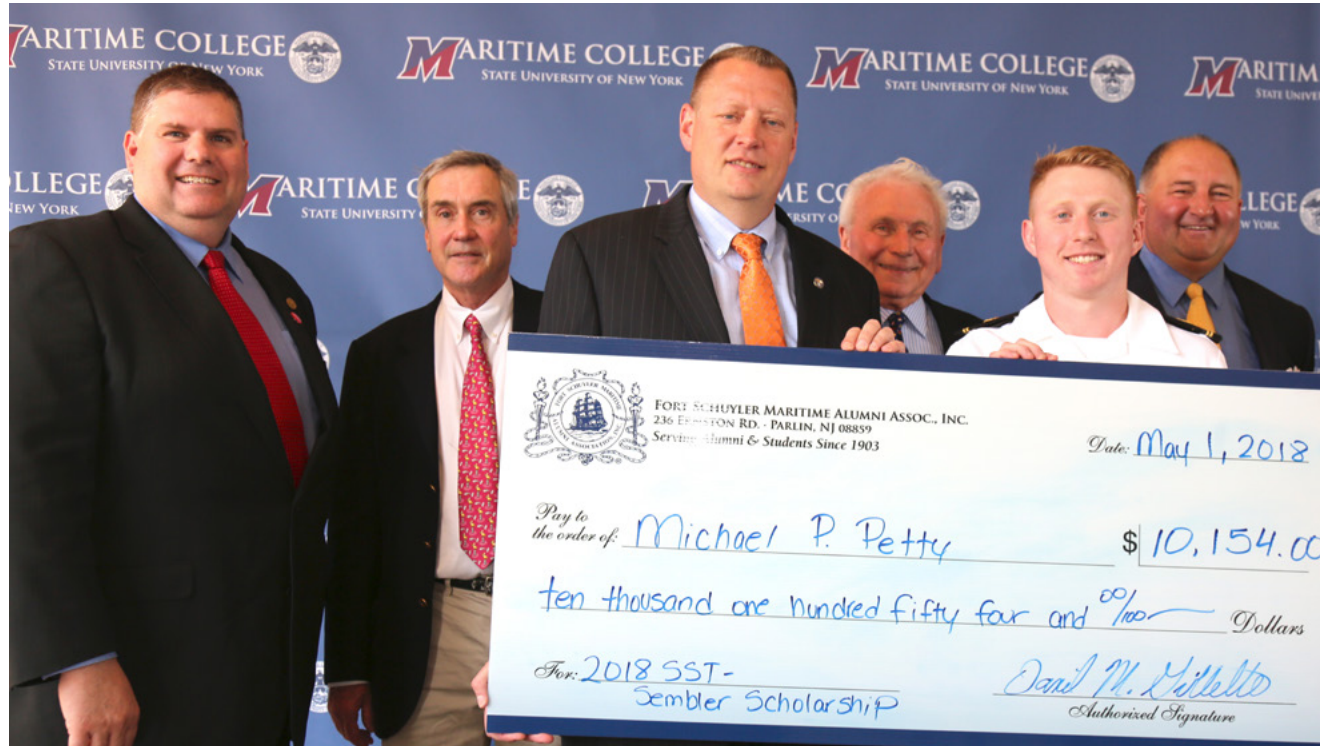
- As expected, there was a drop in values at year-end of our funds managed by Fiduciary Trust International (FTI); overall, the portfolio dropped about 6.794% vs 2017 closing values.
- FTI-managed-funds value decreased by (\$571,795) in 2018. This was predominantly attributable to the drop of the stock market in December 2018.
- The end-of-year balance for the FTI-managed funds was \$7.844 million.
- The three accounts (2 checking plus 1 high-yield savings) at Chase Manhattan total \$138,762.
- In 2018, we distributed a total of \$249,142 to students to help defray the costs of the Summer Sea Term. These scholarships were distributed to 82 deserving cadets.



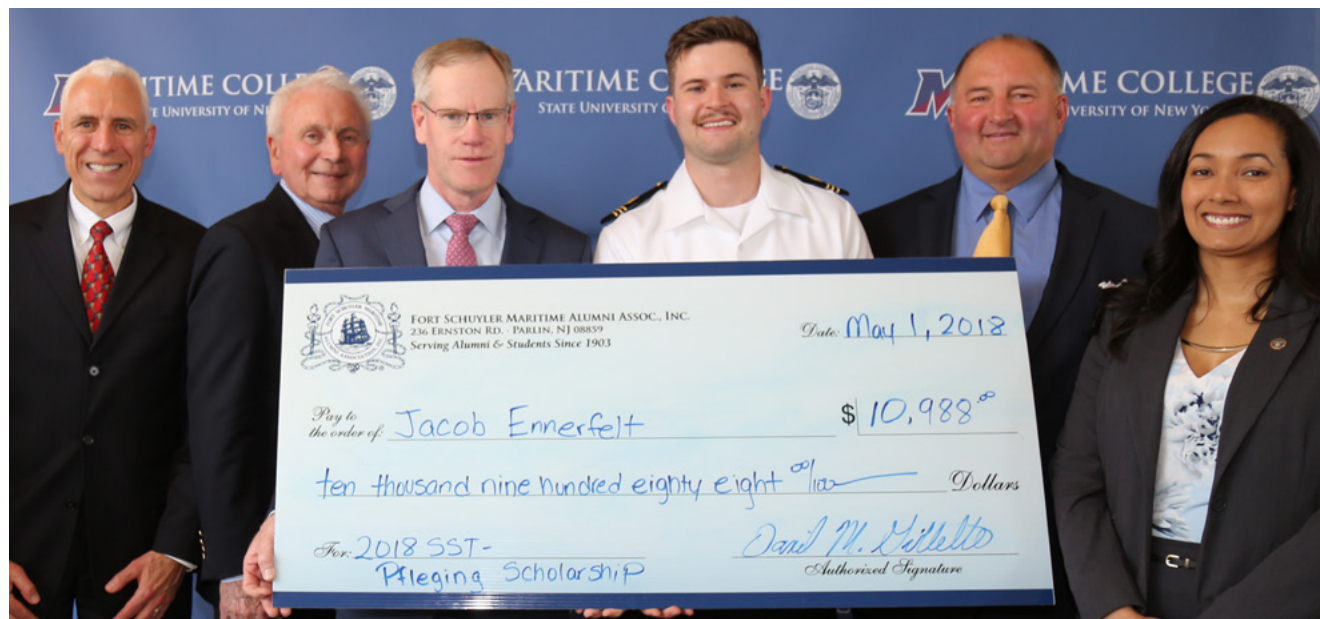

TREASURER'S ANNUAL REPORT

Two outstanding cadets were selected to receive scholarships in the amount of the full cost of the Summer Sea Term. This scholarship money is derived from the interest and dividends on our endowment funds, as well as the generous giving of our Alumni Association membership. **Above** we see Deck Cadet Michael P. Petty who won the Professor Sembler '52 Scholarship in the amount of \$10,154 which is reflective of the in-state cost of SST. Michael is joined by Chris Nystrom '92, Carl Hausheer '79, Dan Gillette '97, Ted Mason '57, Victor Corso '83. **Below** we see Engineering Cadet Jacob Ennerfelt who won the Edward "The Chief" Pflieger Scholarship in the amount of \$10,988, which is reflective of the out-of-state cost of SST. Jacob is joined by Joe Camean '75, Ted Mason '57, Paul Jennings '83, Victor Corso '83, Amie Carter '00.



Since 2004, the FSMAA has donated over \$2,938,948 to the cadets and the College.

Our events throughout the year were a tremendous success!



The **Thirtieth Annual Golf Classic** held at Old Westbury on June 11, 2018 which brought in a profit of

The **Ancient Mariner Fall Golf outing** held coinciding with Homecoming, netted

\$10,439



The **Distinguished Alumni Awards Dinner** held on January 25, 2018 at Tribeca 360 in Manhattan earned a profit of

\$47,374



Various social and networking events throughout the year (**Spring and Fall Networking Socials, Paddy's on the Bay after Homecoming, etc**) resulted in a net loss of **(\$2,818)**. This is due to nominal up-front costs associated with hosting the events and some free giveaways to entice attendance.

With respect to the various casual social and networking events throughout the year, we are actively pursuing sponsorships to offset the costs associated with these events. Sponsors receive prime signage and advertisement at the events. If interested, contact Saira at director@fsmaa.org.

If you have continued your membership to the MCAA by paying your dues for 2019, I extend my thanks to you. If you haven't yet paid your dues, I ask that you consider doing so today – whether by mailing a check in the envelope within this Report, or by paying online at www.fsmaa.org or by calling Denise at (718) 931-6887. You'll see on page 13 that 2018 was short on Membership dues to the tune of (\$19,280). We'd like to plug that hole in 2019; there's still time. Your support is needed for our Alumni Association to continue to thrive. If you haven't attended an event in awhile, please consider doing so. If you know a fellow alum who is not a member, encourage him or her to attend an event with you. The strength of our network is enviable. Let's continue to close our ranks, expand our reach, and make it even stronger.

The consolidated financial statements in this report accurately reflect the organization's financial position, results of operations and workflows. The financial information is prepared in accordance with Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP) in the United States. The financial statements in this document are the complete set presented to our auditors. I have reviewed them, and to the best of my knowledge, they contain no untrue material statements nor do they omit any material facts.
