# 1840: President & Executive Director Report(s):

### Update on MCAA Office:

- Kevin:
  - Parlin, NJ has officially closed and the college address (6 Pennyfield) is now the official address of the MCAA.
- Jeanne:
  - Completed clean up and shredding of applicable documents at the Parlin, NJ office
  - Financial records are being kept offsite, at a temperature controlled storage space. These documents are based on IRS standards regarding what we need to maintain.
  - Stored away event supplies at the college.

## Database Update:

- Kevin:
  - Survey Monkey sent out regarding the database merger
  - Approval of agreement has been finalized, Admiral and Kevin have both signed
  - Next steps: Consultant will assist in merging data between the College and the MCAA
    - Window for completion is 6-8 weeks
    - No start date has been established
- Jeanne:
  - Review of Raiser's Edge Dashboard inputted with Alumni information
  - Mapping feature takes into account Alumni zip codes and presents a visual display of where they are in the U.S.
  - $\circ$   $\,$  No longer will be paying for Raiser's Edge, the College will be paying for the interface.

## Strategic Planning Committee Update:

- Kevin:
  - Dan Gilette '96 will be heading the committee and has begun to fill numerous roles:
    - Jim Tobin President & CEO of Kings Point Alumni Association
    - Mike Driscoll '82 PhD in Education (Higher Ed) with Investment Background
    - Jim Maloney '80 Attorney, instrumental of MCAA By-Laws
    - Jeanne Murphy Exec. Director of MCAA
  - Dan is looking for additional members, particularly alumni from the last 10 years, as well as female and diverse members.
- Jeanne:
  - Update on first strategic planning committee meeting:

- Rough structure established on how the process will go
- Interviews and surveys of constituent base will be integral in forming the strategic plan
  - Initial survey was just sent, 400 emails received
  - Maritime Faculty and Administration will be next in line to receive the survey
  - Will also be posted on Facebook for family members to take part and provide feedback.

## Staffing Changes:

- Kevin:
  - Saira Yoo and Denise Tiernan are no longer employees of the MCAA and have completed their service with the MCAA.
  - Jeanne will continue as Exec. Director and the MCAA will seek a support person to Jeanne
  - Search Committee will be created, headed by Jeanne and made up by members of the Board
- Jeanne:
  - Seeking a "Alumni Relations Associate" positon
    - Salary will be in the range of \$46,000 \$48,000
    - Full time positon on site (MCAA office on campus)
    - Not offering a Benefits package
  - The role will be assisting in database management, particularly with the Raiser's Edge product, as well as:
    - Depositing Electronic Checks
    - Writing Donations
    - Reconciliation with Bookkeeper
    - Events Support
  - Fifteen (15) resumes received thus far
    - No final candidates yet
    - Looking at Temp options until positon is filled

#### Motion to vote for approval of Alumni Relations Associate salary of \$46,000-\$48,000.

#### Email Exchanges with Alumni:

- Kevin:
  - Met with Eileen & Jose Femenia regarding her concerns at her home, in person.
  - Goal is to find a way to move on through establishing a new way forward.
  - Eileen wants to better understand the delta of cadets who receive scholarships from the MCAA, but do not become MCAA members post-graduation.

  - Reminder to the Board of the commitments of attending meetings as per the MCAA By-Laws
  - Will look for in-person meetings with the timing is appropriate (i.e. COVID concerns)

## **1920: Treasurers Report**

Kevin Comerford:

- Budget a. August 31, 2021
  - Net income (\$38,667)
    - \$5,000 increase in dues since the June meeting
    - \$3,500 increase in the Underway Fund since June meeting
    - Golf income \$91,059
    - Ancient Mariner money starting to come in
    - Payroll we are at the budgeted number for the year (and we have 4 months to go).
      - Kevin estimates we will be over budget on payroll by approx. \$35,000
- Funds
  - o January 1, 2021 \$11,746,195
  - August 31 \$12,677,283
    - A total of \$403,108 was withdrawn in 2021 for all the scholarships.
    - \$33,500 added to the fund in 2021.
- Additional Items:
  - Membership Drive is upcoming typically strong revenue stream
  - PPP Loan \$16,200 not included in budget, will be included in profit when loan gets forgiven
  - No awards dinner this year, typical profit is \$45,000 \$50,000 which we expect to see next year
  - No longer paying rent to the Parlin, NJ office, cost save.
  - Setting up meeting with Finance Committee for October 7<sup>th</sup>

## 1935: College Report

Doug Hasbrouck provides the update on behalf of the Admiral

#### Main Updates:

- COVID continues to be a concern all students within SUNY must be vaccinated or they will be dis-enrolled.
- Homecoming Requiring vaccines for indoor events
  - Kings Point and Maine Maritime have cancelled their homecoming events.
- Empire State VI will leave the pier for the shipyard

- NSMV Update The shipyard has requested that alumni not call the shipyard directly for information regarding the construction
  - Admiral will send our weekly updates
  - Keel laying will be scheduled for the first week of December
  - MARAD asked if any Alumni gatherings would be had during the Keel laying in Philadelphia
    - MCAA may be in a position to assist
  - Admirals Dinner scheduled for Tuesday, September 21<sup>st</sup>

## **1945: Committee Updates**

#### **Events Committee – Jeanne Murphy:**

- Working closely with the College and meeting weekly regarding Homecoming

   Assisting in multiple different events for various classes
- Alumni Association Annual Meeting at 11:30am on Homecoming Day
  - Looking into establishing technology to stream the meeting live (YouTube)
- Spirit Wear Sale:
  - Have been working with them over the last 2 weeks, supply chain issues has become a problem for apparel
  - o Cannot guarantee items will be in stock should we establish an online store
    - Recommendation is to not move ahead with online store, but transition to in person

## Motion to spend \$5,000 for purchasing apparel for homecoming.

#### Motion carried, all in favor.

- Ancient Mainer Golf Outing:
  - o 80 golfers registered and \$19,000 in revenue thus far
  - Expect a large contingent of late sign ups

#### Audit Committee – John Valvo:

- Audit for 2020 is in progress; receiving repetitive questions from auditor
  - Supporting them as needed to any requests
- RFQ for new Audit Firm:
  - Per our Memorandum of Understanding with the College, every 3 years, the MCAA issues a proposal for new auditors and ultimately selects one (can be the same as prior)
  - Three (3) proposals have been received and the Audit Committee met and discussed.
  - The due diligence period brought out that the best choices would be the following:
    - 1. Buchbinder Tunick \$16,000 per year (first 2 years), \$17,000 for the 3<sup>rd</sup> year

- 2. Condon O'Meara McGinty & Donnelly \$19,200 first year, \$19,600 second year and \$20,000 for the 3<sup>rd</sup> year
- 3. Prager Metis- \$26,500 all 3 years

Audit Committee makes a recommendation to the Board to utilize Buchbinder Tunick for the MCAA Auditing and Tax Services for the Fiscal Year(s) 2021, 2022 and 2023 in the amount of - \$16,000 per year (first 2 years), and \$17,000 for the 3<sup>rd</sup> year.

# Motion to select Book Binder for the MCAA Auditing and Tax Services for the Fiscal Year(s) 2021, 2022 and 2023.
