# Scholarship Program


Greetings fellow Alumni!

In 2023, the MCAA distributed a record amount of \$495,700.00 to students to help defray the cost of the 2023 Summer Sea Term, awarding to a total of 98 deserving cadets. Two cadets received the full cost of the 2023 Summer Sea Term Tuition (\$7,850.00 in-state). These two Full Tuition Scholarships were presented in the names of Chief Edward Pfleging and Captain William Sembler '52. First-Class cadets received \$5,000 scholarships towards their cruise tuition, equating to covering 64% of their tuition! How great is that! This scholarship money is the result of the financial growth of the many endowment funds under our care and supplemented by the generosity of our Alumni Association membership. Refer to the Treasurers Report for details on the various Fund Performance.

Included in the SST awards was the Class of '65's Scholarships for 2nd Class Cadets (2 Deck and 2 Engine), each in the amount of \$5,000.00. Also included for 2023 was a \$5,000.00 Scholarship Award from the John LaGrassa Class of '83 Fund, which was presented to a Cadet that demonstrated Financial Hardship at the request of the funds sponsor.

In addition to the Summer Sea Term Scholarships listed above, several scholarships were issued throughout the year:

- The Class of October '46 Tomb Speaker Series (Support for the College) - \$5,000.00
- The Charles Balancia Scholarship given to an incoming 4th Class Cadet - \$1,500.00
- The Class of 1967 Academic Scholarship - two (2) Scholarships at \$4,500.00 each

# TREASURER'S REPORT

January 1, 2023 to December 31, 2023



In 2023, the MCAA distributed a total of \$495,700 to students to help defray the costs the Summer Sea Term.

The balance of 2023 awards distributed from funds totaled \$20,500.

Since 2004, the FSMAA has donated over \$4,864,016 to the students and Maritime College.

Dues numbers are down in calendar year 2023 compared to 2022. If you have paid your current year's dues, thank you for your continued membership! If you haven't yet paid your dues, I hope you will consider doing so in the future. Your support is greatly appreciated and needed for our Alumni Association to continue to thrive and to grow. And, we believe that the value of the fellowship and networking opportunities you'll realize as an MCAA member will more than offset your dues payment.

If you have not attended a recent event or have not paid your dues in a while, please consider doing so. If you know a fellow Alumnus who is not a member, encourage them to attend an event with you. Although the Association has been back on campus since 2018 and we now enjoy a mutually benevolent relationship with the College, there are still over 15

years of graduating classes who do not know who we are. The Alumni Association has a long road ahead of us to regain the legacy stature we had in the '70s and the '80s.

The independent auditor Buchbinder Tunick & Company LLP audited our financial statements for 2021 and 2022, with 2023 pending review, and has expressed that our books are in good order. The auditor considered our internal controls to the extent they believe necessary to determine and conduct the audit to render an opinion. They found no significant deficiencies or material weaknesses during their audit, and there were no adjustments made, a trend we are committed to continuing. Our internal controls ensure transactions are authorized, executed, and recorded properly.

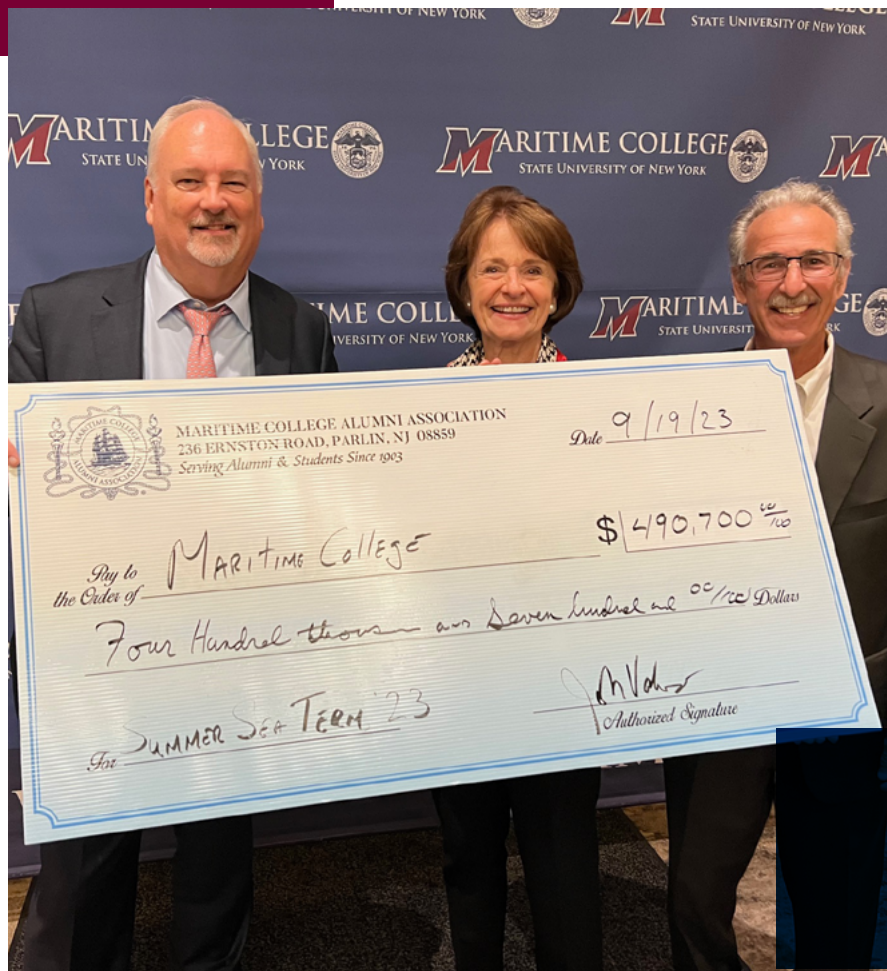
